

### Questions for reflection:

(not intended to be a sermon outline)

You are encouraged to use these as part of a study/devotional/reflection time through the coming week.

You are also encouraged to participate in the Explore Class after worship where we will use these as a discussion starter. Bring your questions as well for discussion.

1. What are common New Year's Resolutions?
2. Why do people make resolutions? What is the desire behind them?
3. Why do so many resolutions fail?
4. Do you find "End Times" Bible passages interesting and drawing of your attention? Do you feel they are important to understand? Why?
5. In our passage today, why does Peter talk about "End Times?" What is the purpose of his description? Does he give much real insight that is useful?
6. Have you ever suffered a large loss of property? Or of some possessions? Or other things you have worked for? How did that make you feel to lose it? What lessons did you take away from the experience?
7. What does it look like to work for spiritual things that will last? Describe that kind of work or life. What is the reward of that now?

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8. What do you think Jesus meant when he talked about giving full or abundant life to people? (John 10:10)
9. What area of your spiritual life do you wish was stronger? What area would you like to grow in? Share with others and be open to their encouragement and sharing of their struggles and insights.
10. What do you think it would be like, the atmosphere, the conversations, the worship, etc., if we were all seeking to grow in some intentional way this year? What would be different?
11. Describe what it would be like to be a guest in our worship if all were seeking to grow spiritually. What would people experience?
12. What would it take for you to pursue an area of growth this year? What will try to hold you back?

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
