

Questions for reflection:

(not intended to be a sermon outline)

You are encouraged to use these as part of a study/devotional/reflection time through the coming week.

You are also encouraged to participate in the Explore Class after worship where we will use these as a discussion starter. Bring your questions as well for discussion.

The unison statement at the end of our worship is this: "Lord, fill us with your Spirit that we may go from here seeking to live by faith, to be known by love, and to be a voice of hope."

1. What is the strength and weakness of a church having a vision statement? Why is it helpful? What might not be helpful? How can it be best used?
2. What does it mean to you to "have faith?" What does that mean? How does it affect your life?
3. What have you understood the phrase "To live by faith" to mean before today?
4. When you see people who claim to be a Christian, not act like one, what does that say about their faith?
5. Of course we all fail to walk in faith fully and perfectly, but what does it mean to "Live by Faith" in today's culture? What are the biggest challenges?
6. Is doubt or disobedience a way of saying I trust myself and my wisdom more than God's in His word and promises?

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7. What temptations, or situations do Christians face that pull us off course in walking by faith?
8. What are the more immediate rewards of living by faith?
9. What might people that "doubt" decide to live by if not by faith? How does that show up?
10. How can we help one another to walk by faith?

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
